Magnets division: Carbone Lorraine focuses on ferrite magnets

Carbone Lorraine has just signed a letter of intent regarding the disposal of its specialties magnets activity.

This transaction follows on from the disposal, in October 2000, of the Group's magnets for computers activity, and completes the refocusing of its "Permanent Magnets" division on small electric motors.

The specialties magnets activity manufactures products for a wide variety of industrial outlets (magnetic fixings, electrical metering, etc.) and turns over annual sales of about 13 million euros. There is no synergy with the Group's other activities or divisions.

The transaction could be finalized within a few months, after consultation between labor and management, and after completing the usual supplementary procedures. The disposal price is likely to be about 5 ME and should generate a capital gain for the Group.

This disposal will enable the "Permanent Magnets" division to focus fully on the improvement actions which have been initiated at its five ferrite magnet plants, and on the development of its markets: rapid diversification of the customer base in North America, penetration of Asian markets and keeping pace with the very strong growth currently being experienced in magnet assemblies in Europe.
